

Dazzlingly Inventive Guitar Virtuoso Sean Shibe to make Australian Debut

SCOTLAND UNBOUND

7-20 November National Tour



Electric and acoustic guitar virtuoso Sean Shibe is a musical chameleon of the new generation. The Scottish-Japanese guitarist transcends genres and conventions, renowned for his dazzling performances of both ancient and new works that have established him as a truly original mind at the frontier of contemporary music.

Shibe will make his much-anticipated Australian debut with the Australian Chamber Orchestra, in a national tour directed by Artistic Director Richard Tognetti that celebrates the guitarist's Scottish heritage. Shibe will take to the stage with both electric and acoustic instruments, playing music ranging from the irresistible melodies of traditional Scottish folk songs to exhilarating and inventive new music including Martyn Bennett's Bothy Culture, which draws inspiration from Edinburgh's iconic 90s rave scene, Julia Wolfe's Lad, described by the composer as a "dive into a psychedelic landscape", and a brand-new work by Canadian composer Cassandra Miller, Chanter, that involved Shibe contributing vocals to be used in the creation of the work.

Shibe's experimental and open-minded approach to music-making makes him a perfect match for the electric energy and musical curiosity of the ACO.

"I am looking forward to this tour with every bone in my body; excited to forge friendships anew with the fabulous musicians of the Australian Chamber Orchestra," Shibe says.

"I am beyond delighted that the program is one that represents the sounds and influences of Scotland, its history and its future; a heady, oxymoronic mashup of Wee Free Church of Scotland, guilty 90s dance house hedonism and reflectively ornamented pibroch-adjacent meditations."

Born in Edinburgh in the early 90s, Shibe was the first ever guitarist awarded selection in the prestigious BBC New Generation Artist program and has won awards including the Borletti-Buitoni Trust Fellowship and the Leonard Bernstein Award. He has released seven critically acclaimed recordings, with his 2020 recording of JS Bach described as *"the best ever Bach recording on guitar"* (*Gramophone*) while his 2022 recording *Lost* & Found was praised by *The Guardian* in its 5-star review as *"another bonkers-at-first-glance, brilliant album"*. In addition to being a revered performer of baroque and renaissance music, Shibe is an ardent supporter of contemporary music, taking a hands-on approach to new commissions and working with composers to experiment with and expand the guitar repertoire.
